Prevention Services Available

Primary Prevention Services are provided in an eleven County Region: Daniels, Dawson, Garfield, McCone, Phillips, Prairie, Richland, Roosevelt, Sheridan, Valley and Wibaux counties. Services provided include:

Funding of Services

Primary treatment and assessment services are funded by Medicaid, Private Insurance, State Block Grant Money, and self-pay on sliding fee scale. In using the sliding fee scale, eighty percent of clients pay \$10 or less per session. ACT (\$200) and MIP (\$100) courses are mandated by law to be self supporting and are self pay only. All Prevention Services are 100% grant funded.

To Access Services

Individuals or referents may contact our office in order to make an appointment to see a counselor and discuss personal options. It is the goal of District II to see clients within one week of the initial contact.

Chemical Dependency & Prevention Services

Mission Statement

District II Alcohol & Drug Program is committed to helping our communities and individuals live happier, healthier, and more productive lives by providing science-based substance abuse prevention and co-occurring capable treatment services.

Outpatient Counseling

The program is designed to treat chemically dependent individuals willing to participate in the development of a support network for abstinence while continuing regular employment and family living. Outpatient services in Dawson, McCone, Prairie, Richland and Wibaux counties.

Assessment/Evaluation

This program helps clients identify problems with chemical dependency and refers them for appropriate treatment.

MIP (Minor In Possession)

This education program is offered to minors convicted of illegal possession of intoxicating substances. The program consists of an intake interview and six hours of education on the social, emotional, and physical effects of substance abuse. Parents are legally mandated to attend a 2-hour session.

ACT (Assessment, Course, Treatment)

This program is a course for DUI, .02 and 3rd MIP offenders. The first step is an intake interview and assessment. The class consists of one two-hour session per week for four weeks. Following the completion of the class, the client participates in an exit interview where findings and recommendations of the assessment phase are given as well as any further treatment referral recommendations.





Employee Assistance Program

The program is designed to assist employers and employees by providing confidential and professional counseling services to help resolve problems that affect the employee's personal life or job performance.

Intervention

This program provides training sessions for concerned persons on the intervention process. The process is structured to penetrate the denial systems of individuals impaired by alcohol or other substances, assess each individual's degree of impairment, help that individual see his or her need for assistance, and determine the appropriate method of treatment for each individual.

24-Hour Crisis Services

The Crisis Hotline provides 24-hour counseling services in conjunction with the local Mental Health Center to aid individuals who are in need of immediate, urgent care.

Youth / Adult Case Management

Staff personnel are dedicated to helping adolescents as well as adults make informed life choices and goals.

Regional Alcohol & Drug Awareness Resource (RADAR) Center

The resource center provides a variety of current, research-based substance abuse prevention, intervention, and treatment materials that are accessible to members in the community at no personal cost.

Tobacco Education Course

Program for youth in violation of tobacco laws that gives basic information on the processes and effects of tobacco use.

SAP/DOT

Substance Abuse Prevention/Department of Transportation Evaluation. Self pay \$250.

Prevention Services

A full time prevention staff that participates in the development of risk and protective factor-based community activities. The prevention staff concentrations include Alcohol, Tobacco, and Other Drugs (ATOD), as well as suicide prevention services.
